Ninety-two percent of the graduate students passed the comprehensive examination after the first attempt. Finance/managed care was the area of greatest difficulty.</p> <p>1b. Sixty-six percent of the graduate students responding indicated agreement on this issue.</p> <p>2a. Eighty-nine percent of the graduates are employed as mid-level managers in local health care facilities.</p> <p>2b. Sixty-three percent were satisfied with the preparation they received in the masters program.</p> <p>3a. One hundred percent of the students who graduated related the appropriate experiences during the interview.</p> <p>3b. Although only seventy-two percent passed the respective sections on the first attempt, one hundred percent passed after the second attempt.</p>	<p>1a. Target met. Faculty discussed ways to enhance statistical, finance, and accounting skills. Continue to monitor.</p> <p>1b. Target not met. Students were evaluating instruction where forty-five percent was delivered by adjunct faculty. Two faculty have been hired since. Continue to monitor.</p> <p>2a. Target met. Faculty are pleased to support the healthcare community of Central Florida. Continue to monitor.</p> <p>2b. Target not met. The students who expressed dissatisfaction with the program indicated they wanted a greater hospital-oriented experience or a public health experience.</p> <p>3a. Target met. Students have been able to relate appropriate experiences from the curriculum. Continue to monitor.</p> <p>3b. Target not met. Students evidenced a strength on the management component of the curriculum. The finance managed care and research design areas remain a challenge. The faculty is considering increasing prerequisite requirements. Continue to monitor.</p>
